Why This Matters

Tech-facilitated abuse = human rights issue

Disproportionately harms LGBT+ HRDs & GBV survivors

Erodes safety, silences voices, shrinks civic space

Impact

[The police] searched all our phones. They took my phone and started sending messages to each other from my phone, then they took screenshots of those conversations and screenshots from my photo gallery. They took photos and videos where I have makeup or a dress on, and they used them as evidence against me. They went through my WhatsApp chats and took contact details so they could entrap my friends as well.

—Amar, 25-year-old transgender woman from Jordan

[The police] took me to the “morality ward” and kept me until 4 a.m. in a tiny room with no food or water. They took my phone and belongings. When they came back with a police report, I was surprised to see the guy I met on Grindr is one of the officers. They beat me and cursed me until I signed papers that said I was “practicing debauchery” and publicly announcing it to fulfill my “unnatural sexual desires.”

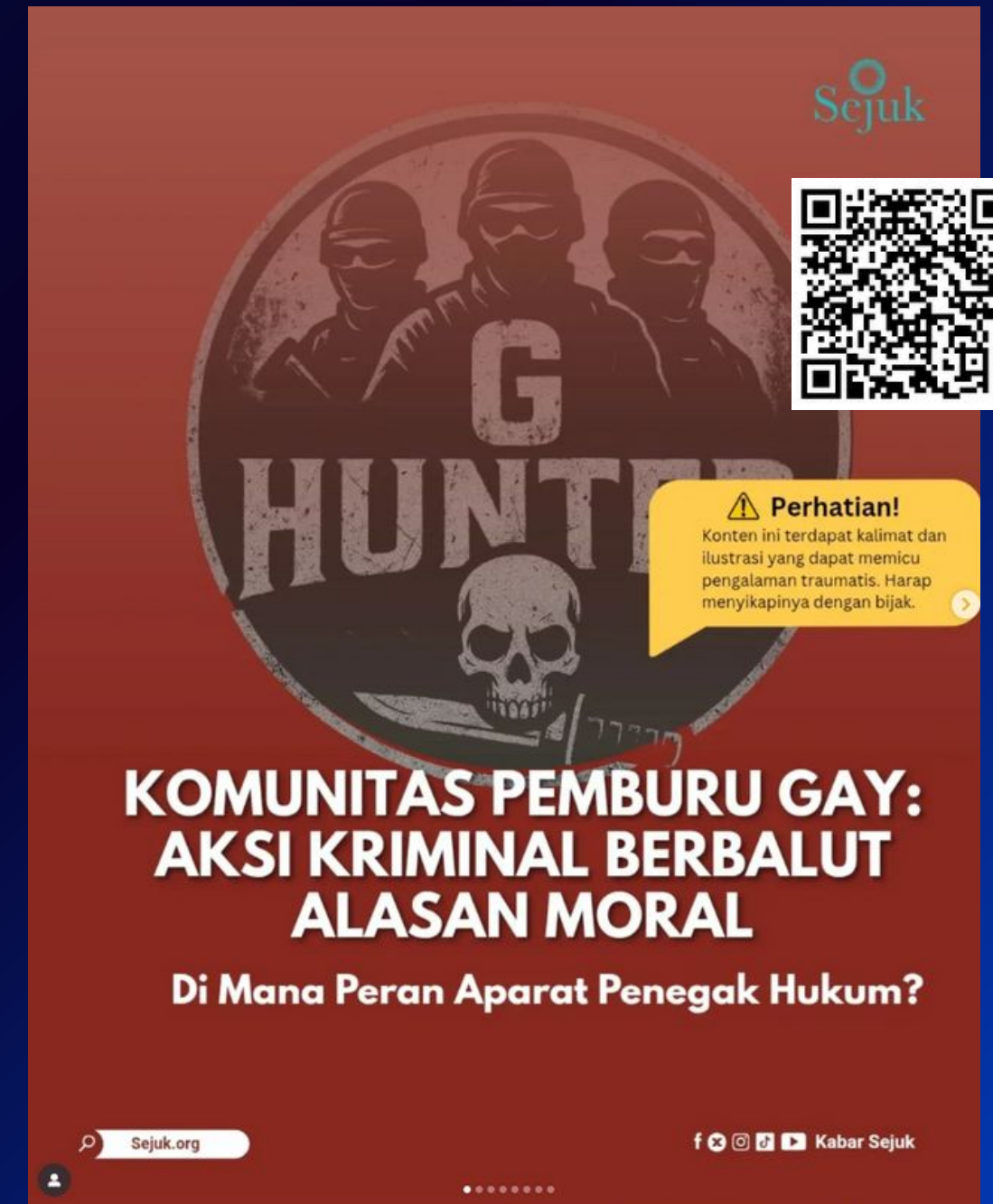
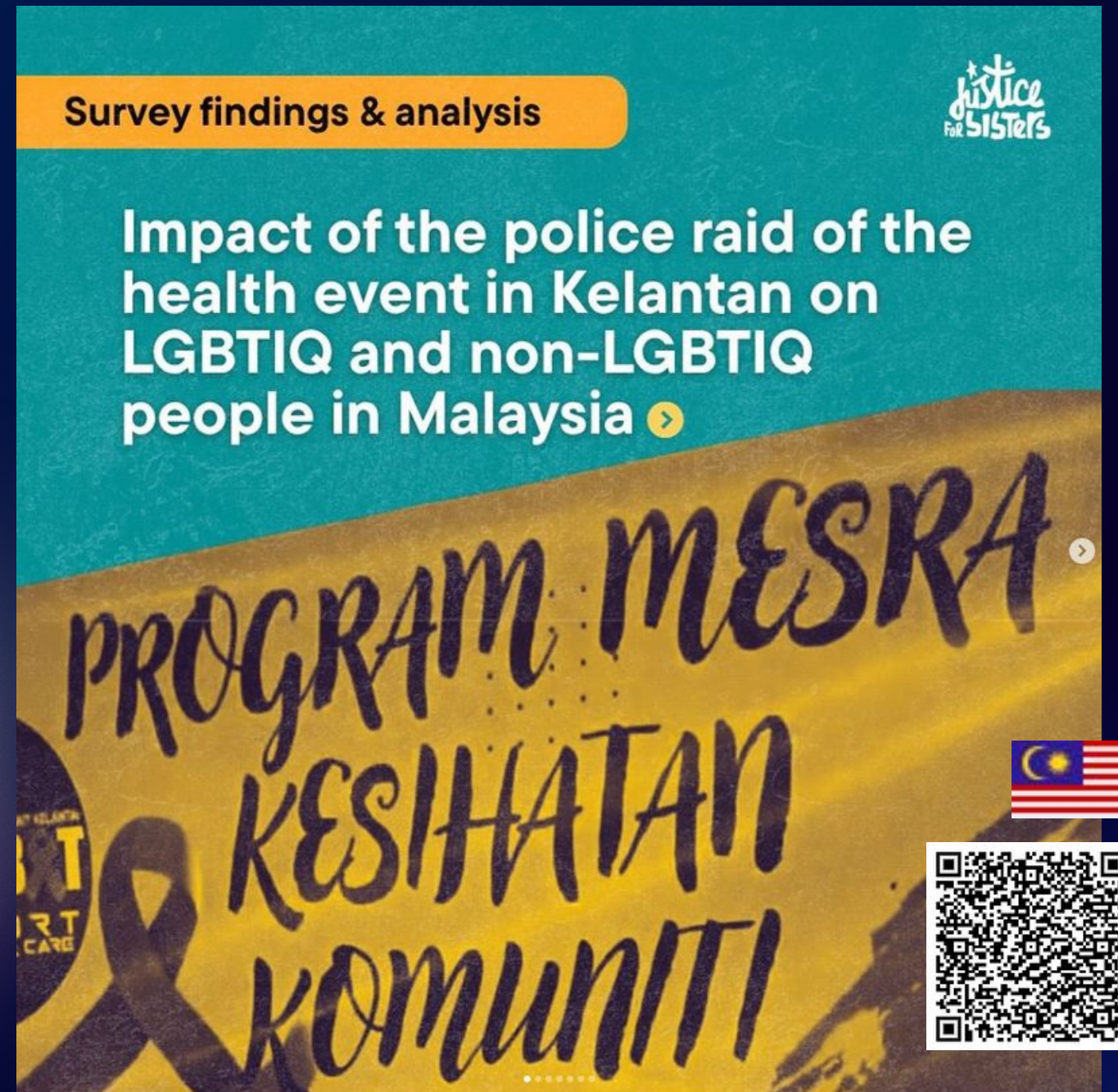

The organiser of a Pride Day event held last Saturday has explained the reasons behind conducting the programme.

Pelangi Campaign president Numan Afifi was responding to an article by a portal which called the programme a "big gay iftar (breaking of fast)" event.

Admitting that he was bombarded with questions from his family, colleagues, friends and the public following the event, Numan explained that the original idea for the programme was to "unite people from various backgrounds through a breaking of fast event".

"It was aimed to go back to basics by having a dialogue with each other and getting to know one's beliefs, culture and identity," he said in a Facebook posting.

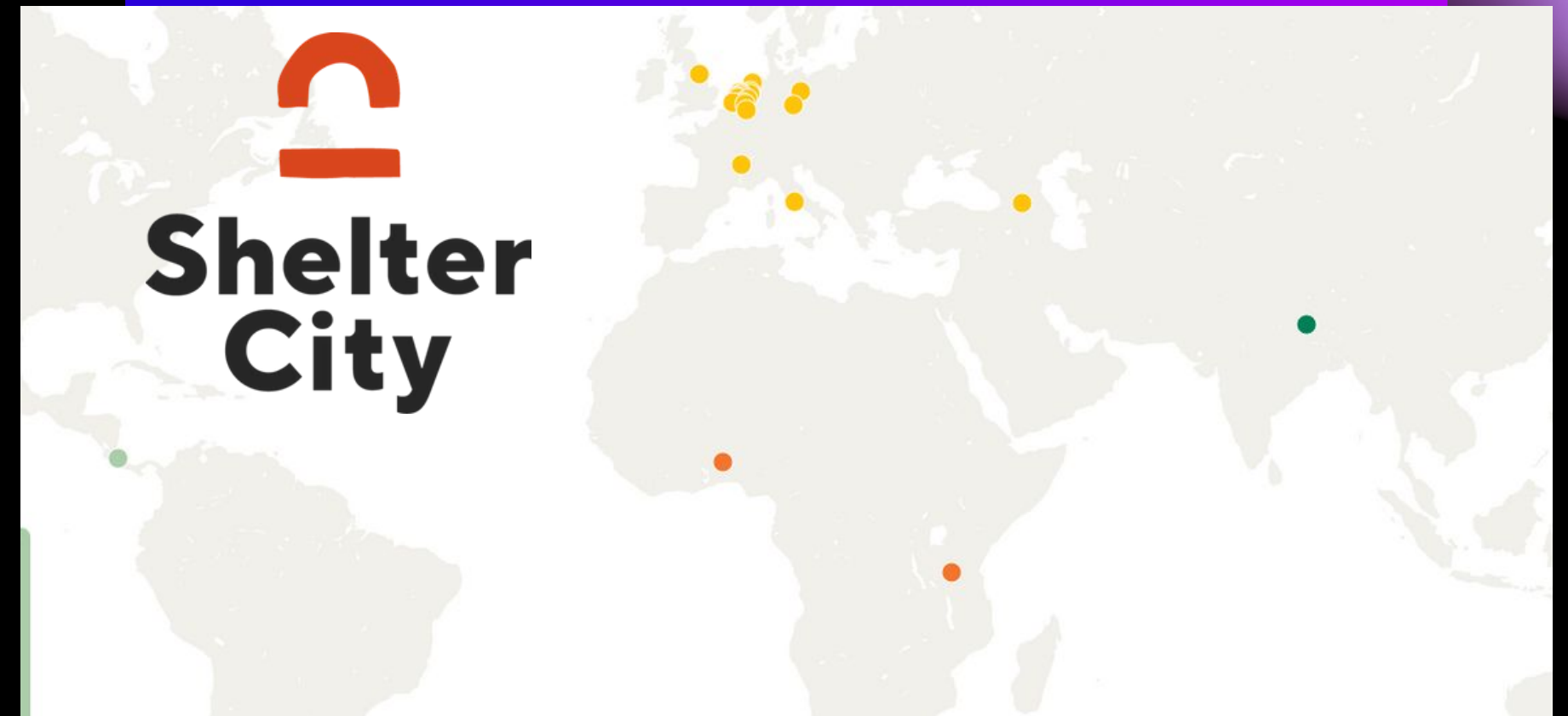

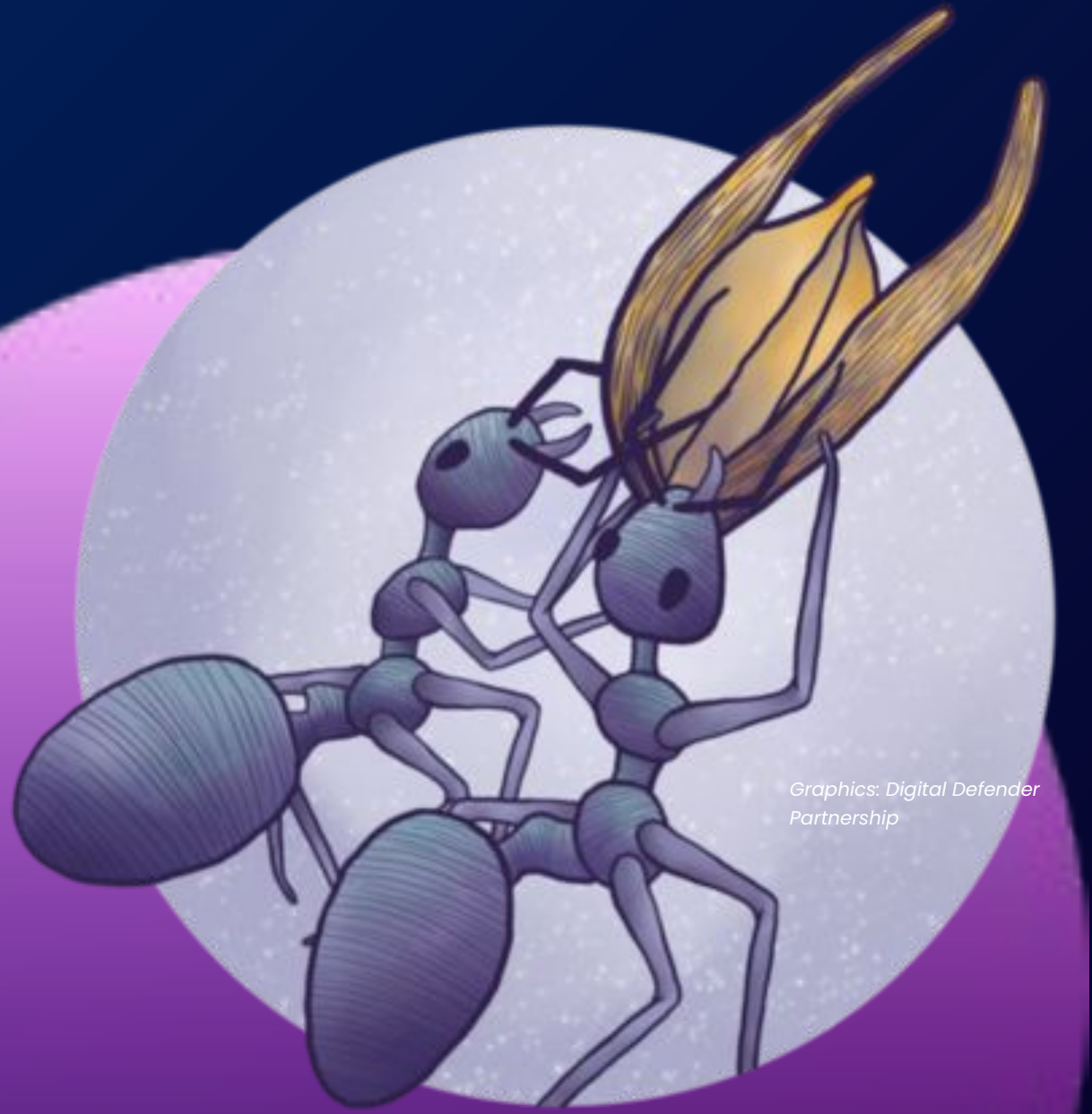
